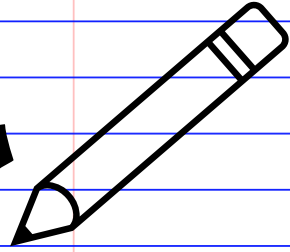

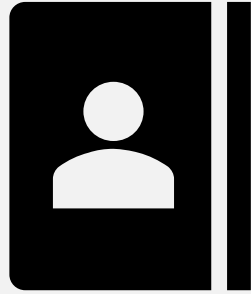

WHAT IS MLA?



-MLA is an abbreviation for, "Modern. Language. Association.

-MLA is used to credit authors and is a system used to for documenting sources.

-Who Created MLA? Aaron Marshall Eliot. In 1883 Aaron founded the Modern Language Association after graduating from Harvard and being a professor at John Hopkins.

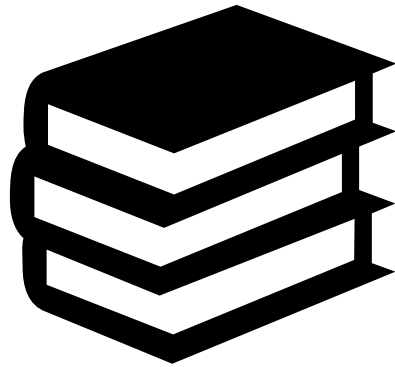
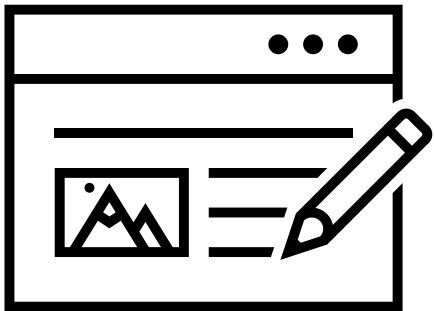

WHAT TO DO WHILE CITING...

1 -List the source (Book of life)then, list the name of the Author, after that give the location:

- (Helping Hand, Huey, pg.2)
- If you are paraphrasing or quoteing it is recommended you use a locator.
- PG.2 or Section 5.

EXAMPLES :- D

MLA In-Text Citations Multiple Authors

- Both names included; joined by the word “and”
(Cortez and Jones 56)
- Three or more authors, use first author’s last name followed by the abbreviation “et al.”
(Cortez et al. 378)

MLA Anthology Citation Example

Format for Citation:

Last name, First name. "Title of Essay." *Title of Collection*, edited by Editor's Name(s), Publisher, Year, page range of entry.

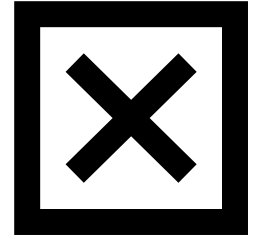
Citation Example:

Author's last name, First name. "Title of Essay." *Title of Collection*,
Hughes, Langston. "Aunt Sue's Stories." *The Collected Poems of
Langston Hughes*, edited by Arnold Rampersad, Knopf, 2004, p. 23.
edited by Editor's Name(s), Publisher, Year, page range of entry.
